  - we are presenting a poster about our collaboration with MRU at the upcoming Canadian Association of Pediatric Health Centers (CAPHC) national conference in October


### CAYAC & MRU NURSING

- Collaboration began in 2005 when Andrea started working at MRU
  - previous experience with CAYAC for other ACH projects
- CAYAC advisory role was sought out for a variety of priorities in child health nursing education, scholarship and service including:
  - Research on children's role as partners in family-centered care (FCC)
  - Curriculum design for new degree or "Build A Nurse" (like build a bear)
    - Leading to national presentation "Tell Your Nurses We Don't Live in the Hospital
- Most recent, and extensive collaboration was for a board game project based on findings from the research on children's roles in FCC
